<b>Geography</b>	<p><b>Investigate places</b> Use world maps, atlases and globes to name, locate and identify the UK and its countries, capital cities and surrounding seas. Ask and answer geographical questions. Identify key human and physical features using aerial photographs of the four countries. Identify famous landmarks Identify and describe the key features of cities, towns and villages. Identify the similarities and differences between urban and rural areas.</p> <p><b>Investigate patterns</b> Identify seasonal weather patterns.</p> <p><b>Communicate Geographically</b> Devise a simple map and use and construct basic symbols in a key including the four compass points (N,S,E,W)</p>

<b>Art</b>	<p>Describe the work of a notable artist</p> <p>Collect visual information e.g. collages.</p> <p>Respond ideas and starting points.</p> <p>Create artwork inspired by ideas from studied artists.</p> <p>Use clay to roll, cut, mould and carve to create a sculpture.</p> <p>Show pattern and texture using dots, lines and different thicknesses,</p> <p>Colour within the lines and in one direction.</p>
